The 43rd annual Cranberry Fest, an Eagle River Area Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Center-sponsored event, will be held Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 7-8.

This year's festival will again be located at the Vilas County Fairgrounds on Highway 70 W., with additional activities downtown on Saturday only.

Cranberry Fest has something for everyone — an arts and crafts show with more than 250 booths, cranberry food sales, a bakery, family fun, entertainment, sweatshirt and T-shirt sales, and more.

With more than 40,000 people attending the festival annually, it is one of the highlights of the fall.

Downtown activities will include an open-air antiques market, farmers market, food and entertainment.

While you're at the fairgrounds, check out the food tent. You'll find soups, charbroiled sand-

Cranberry Fest is made possible by many volunteers who help organize, set up, clean up and everything in between for this festival.

Please ... No pets!

Fest organizers remind visitors that pets and animals are not allowed at Vilas County Fairgrounds, according to Parks and Recreation Chapter Ordinance 19.08 Animals.

"This ordinance will be enforced by event organizers and area law enforcement. You will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and could be fined, so please leave your animals at home," said a fest

spokesperson.

In addition to any vendor, exhibitor and food concessionaire areas located at Vilas County Fairgrounds, pets are not allowed at Riverside Park or Eagle River tennis courts.

"In areas where permitted, pets shall be kept on a leash no more than 8 feet long. All pets shall be effectively restrained or under the owner's control at all times," the spokesperson said.

Activities planned downtown Saturday

While there will be a lot of activity at the Vilas County Fairgrounds during Cranberry Fest, there also will be plenty of attractions in downtown Eagle River.

The festivities will include a farmers market, an antiques show and a food stand — all within just a few feet of dozens of unique shops in downtown Eagle River. Featured food will include many delicious cranberry-flavored products.

For the convenience of festivalgoers, the first three blocks of Wall Street will be closed to traffic for the antiques show and farmers market Saturday.

In addition, a bus shuttle will provide transportation between the fairgrounds and downtown.

"People visiting the area are encouraged to extend their stay at Cranberry Fest in downtown Eagle River," said Kim Emerson, executive director of the Eagle River Area Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Center.

Antiques show

A favorite annual attraction of Cranberry Fest is

scheduled to return this year, with the open-air antiques market Saturday, Oct. 7.

The Eagle River Chamber of Commerce will host the event. The show will be held from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on the first three blocks of Wall Street.

A variety of antiques and collectibles will be available for sale, including glass-

ware, jewelry, furniture, sporting goods and more.

Farmers market

Fresh fall produce will be available from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 7, in downtown Eagle River. A variety of fresh produce will be for sale on Wall Street. Fresh cranberries and Craisins® can be purchased downtown.

Free bus shuttle offered at festival

Bus shuttle service will be available to transfer people to all the activities during Cranberry Fest.

The shuttle will run from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 7.

The shuttle will pick up interested individuals at the east gate of the fairgrounds near the tennis courts.

Buses will run approximately every half-

hour Saturday, with stops at Olson Memorial Library, First Congregational United Church of Christ and Eagle River Area Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Center for marsh tours.

There will be one bus stop downtown Saturday for the antiques show and farmers market at BMO Harris Bank at the corner of First and Wall streets.

More than 400 volunteers make it happen at festival

The Eagle River area is known for its Chain of Lakes and its chain of events throughout the year.

Cranberry Fest the first full weekend in October is one of the biggest links in that chain, thanks to hundreds of volunteers who help make it all possible.

Volunteers are the key to every community event in the area and Cranberry Fest is no different.

According to Kim Emerson, executive director at the Eagle River Area Chamber of Commerce & Visitors Center, Cranberry Fest has an incredible number of enthusiastic volunteers who give graciously of their time and talents.

Emerson said that without all of these people, Cranberry Fest would not be possible.

While planning for this year's event, Williams noted that Cranberry Fest utilized more than 400 volunteers, giving more than 2,000 hours during the festival alone.

"People are really surprised when you start talking about how many volunteers it takes to carry out Cranberry Fest," said Emerson.

She noted many volunteers come back year after year because they enjoy the event so much.

"We are fortunate many of the volunteers return year after year, working in the same areas, while some choose to try something new. Plus, these people, along with friends and family, are always willing to help out in a pinch," she said.

Emerson said a frequent comment heard from all the new volunteers is, "I never knew how much fun it could be to help. I'll be back next year."

Comments heard about the volunteers from visitors are equally positive.

"Cranberry Fest has happy volunteers. Everyone is so helpful, that's why we like to come to Eagle River," said a festival veteran.

Out-of-town visitors also ask how the chamber can accomplish its many large events.

"How can Eagle River organize so many great events? How do you get all those volunteers? We could never do that. Do you know how lucky you are?"

Emerson responds with, "We are very fortunate to have these people and we greatly appreciate all that they continue to do for the events of Eagle River, especially Cranberry Fest."

Cranberry Fest is an all-volunteer, community-wide event. Volunteers range in age from 9 to 90, and come from all over the area. No experience is necessary and training is provided.

Festival volunteers are treated to coffee and lunch in a heated tent designated just for them during the weekend.

New volunteers are always welcome and the hours are flexible. If you are interested in volunteering at any of the Eagle River area events, call the chamber at 715-479-6400.

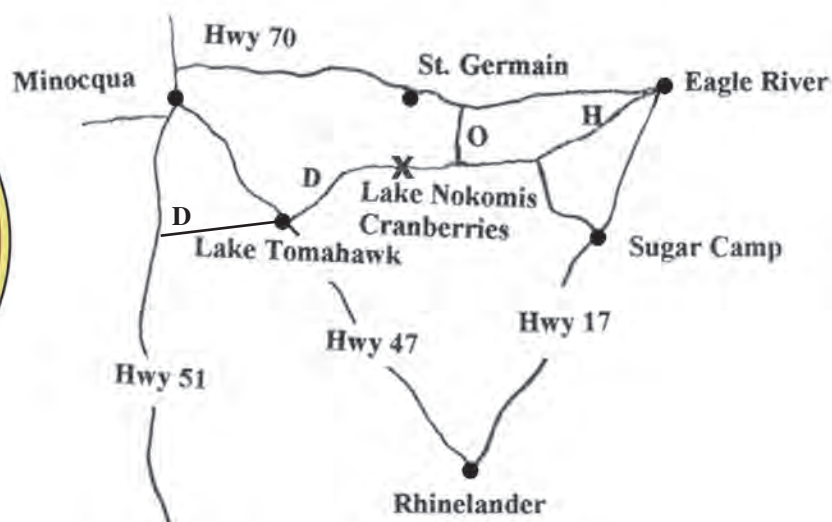
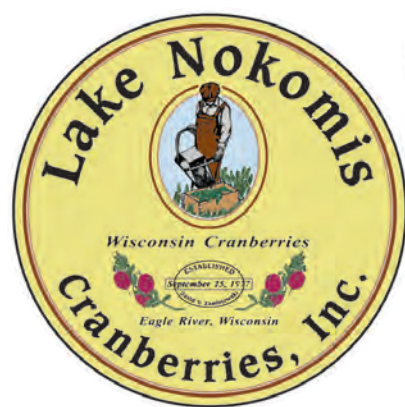

Visitors, area residents invited to tour working cranberry marsh

Eagle River Cranberry Fest continues to be a special event for North Woods residents and visitors with many activities for all, including the opportunity to visit and tour a working cranberry marsh.

Tours of area marshes have been taking place for more than three decades, resulting in visitors gaining insight and knowledge about the importance of cranberries to Wisconsin.

Visitors to the fest can take a guided tour of one of the largest cranberry marshes in the area — Lake Nokomis Cranberries — located right here in Eagle River.

Tour attendees will visit a marsh that has called Eagle River home for more than 75 years, learn the history of the cranberry marsh and how it has been developed into a 334-acre marsh throughout the years, see the layout of the cranberry marsh close-up

with a scenic drive on the marsh, and learn about harvest equipment.

Tour guides will explain the hard work that needs to be done at the marsh spring, summer, fall and winter. Visitors will learn why Wisconsin is No. 1 in cranberry production, plus they'll find out all of the

health benefits received from eating cranberries.

After the scenic tour of the marsh itself, the second stop of the tour will be at the Lake Nokomis Cranberries tasting area where they will be able to sample Lake Nokomis cranberry wine and other local wines.

There also will be samples of cranberry barbecue sauce, chocolate-covered cranberries and yogurt-covered cranberries.

The last stop of the tour will be at the Lake Nokomis Cranberries Wine & Gift Shop, where visitors will find many cranberry-related items, including cranberry wines, lotions, soaps, candles, sauces, jams and those delicious sweetened, dried cranberries. Also available will be farm-fresh cranberries straight from the marsh.

To become a part of the two-hour cranberry marsh tour and wine tasting, people should make their reservations early. Tours are very popular and book up quickly. Tours run Thursday, Oct. 5, through Sunday, Oct. 8.

To reserve a spot on the tour, call the Eagle River chamber at 1-(800) 359-6315 or (715) 479-6400.

Premium select berries offered at three locations

The Eagle River Area Chamber of Commerce & Visitors Center will have premium select cranberries for sale at the 43rd anniversary celebration of Cranberry Fest Oct. 7-8.

Fest spectators can look for fresh cranberry sales located throughout the community at three locations — the Cranberry Fest grounds at Vilas County Fairgrounds, the Eagle River Area Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Center at 201 N. Railroad St., and downtown Eagle River at the corner of Railroad and Wall streets.

Only the best berries will be sold, according to chamber Executive Director Kim Emerson.

"The berries are high-quality, premium select, because they follow the U.S. Department of Agriculture processing standards for fresh cranberries," she said. "The



fresh fruit is hand-sorted, clean, mature, firm and free from moisture, bruising and decay."

Each berry is approximately one-half inch in size and displays a fairly uniform red to deep purple color.

"Don't forget to take home fresh cranberries, and if you haven't tried Craisins®, be sure to get some of those too," she said.

Weavers, fiber artist groups to host exhibit and sale on Saturday, Oct. 7

A variety of fiber artists will be at the one-day Lake Country Weavers and Fiber Artists Guild exhibit and sale during Cranberry Fest in Eagle River.

Hosted by guild members, the exhibit will be held Saturday, Oct. 7, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the First Congregational United Church of Christ.

The church is located at 105 N. First Street (corner of First and Division streets) in downtown Eagle River. Admission to both the exhibit and sale is free.

The Cranberry Fest shuttle bus from the fairgrounds will stop in front of the church at regular intervals on Saturday.

“If you have ever wondered how wool from a

sheep in the meadow turns into a warm scarf or sweater, this is the place to be,” said weaver Mary Jackl. “You will see members spinning fiber into yarn using a traditional spinning wheel or an electric spinning wheel. You might even be there when the beads are plied into the finished yarn.”

Jackl noted that, because the typical weaving loom is rather large and difficult to move, one member will be demonstrating band weaving and tapestry weaving on smaller looms.

“Another member is a prolific knitter and seamstress. She will have on hand many of her items including mittens, hats, socks, bibs and blankets,”

she added. “And a fiber show would not be complete without a knitting demonstration. A number of our members are accomplished knitters. If you have a question, they can offer their assistance.”

The church will be filled with a variety of items for sale that were made by the guild members. The pews will be covered with hand woven rugs and table runners. Interspersed among the rugs will be hand-knit wool/mohair mittens, knit and then felted wool clogs and hats, hand-knit acrylic mittens, handspun yarns and many small novelty items that are a must-see.

The Lake Country Weavers and Fiber Artists Guild helps support weavers, knitters, crocheters, rug hookers, spinners and other fiber artists in the North Woods.

To further education and camaraderie, monthly meetings are held. A wide geographical area is covered from Land O’ Lakes to Rhinelander, Manitowish Waters to Phelps.

Festival grounds parking to see changes in 2023

The task of getting an estimated 40,000 people to and from the Vilas County Fairgrounds for Cranberry Fest is a huge undertaking and will see some changes to operation this year.

All festival grounds parking for the 2023 event will only be able to enter from Highway 70 on to South Forrest Street, which will be a one-way street.

Drivers are asked to pay attention to signage and ask volunteers who will be on hand to direct traffic where they should exit the

fairgrounds.

Parking assistance will again be provided by the Eagle River Lions Club at a cost of \$10 per car. Club members will be able to answer directional questions as well as guide fest-goers to the designated parking areas at the fairgrounds.

Proceeds from the parking fee will go to the Lions Club and Eagle River Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Center to support area projects and events.

Food tent to include pancake breakfast

The main food tent at Cranberry Fest is managed by the Greater Eagle River Tennis Association (GERTA).

In addition to soup, sandwiches, and hot and cold drinks for lunch, a pancake breakfast will be served Saturday and Sunday mornings, Oct. 7-8, by the tennis group.

The pancake breakfast has been popular for vendors staying on the grounds as well as early morning festivalgoers.

Hungry customers will enjoy their choice of regular or cranberry pancakes, pork sausage and a drink.

Breakfast will be served from 7 to 10 a.m. both mornings. Lunch will be served after 10 a.m.

Badger State expected to provide 60% of nation's cranberry crop

International demand growing

Wisconsin's cranberry growers are expecting a 4.97 million barrel crop in 2023, based on U.S. Cranberry Marketing Committee (CMC) crop projections.

If the projections stay on course, Wisconsin will remain the largest cranberry producer in the world, growing and harvesting approximately 60% of the nation's supply.

The CMC forecast, based on grower surveys, marks the 29th year that Wisconsin has led the nation in cranberry production.

The other largest cranberry growing states and their 2023 crop size projections are: Massachusetts at 1.95 million barrels; New Jersey at 561,000 barrels, Oregon at 520,000 barrels and Washington at 168,000.

In total, the U.S. crop is expected to be 8.17 million barrels, according to the CMC. Wisconsin's final 2022 crop came in at 4.84 million barrels.

"Wisconsin is a global leader in cranberry production, generating \$1 billion in state economic impact and providing thousands of local jobs across the Wisconsin, and we are proud to continue that tradition in 2023," said Tom Lochner, executive director of the Wisconsin State Cranberry Growers Association. "Our 250-plus multigenerational family farmers are hard at work preparing for harvest season, and will soon have another crop of cranberries ready for tables across the U.S. and around the world."

The U.S. cranberry industry has worked hard in recent decades to increase consumption of cranberries outside of the U.S. and grow international demand.

According to the CMC, from Sept. 1, 2021 to Aug. 31, 2022, 53% of production volume was exported. Earlier this summer, CMC announced that exports to Columbia had increased 80% from 2017-'18 to 2021-'22. Other top international cranberry markets include the United Kingdom, European Union, China, Mexico and South Korea.

Wisconsin cranberries are grown on 21,000 acres across 20 counties in central and northern regions of the state. Approximately 5% of this year's crop will be sold as fresh fruit, and the remaining cranberries will be frozen and stored for longer-term sales as frozen berries, dried cranberries, juices, sauces and more.

Wisconsin's cranberry harvest typically begins in late September and runs until mid-October.

WSCGA was founded in 1887 and is committed to developing and implementing programs that will assist growers in doing a better job of growing cranberries and strengthening the public support for the industry in Wisconsin.

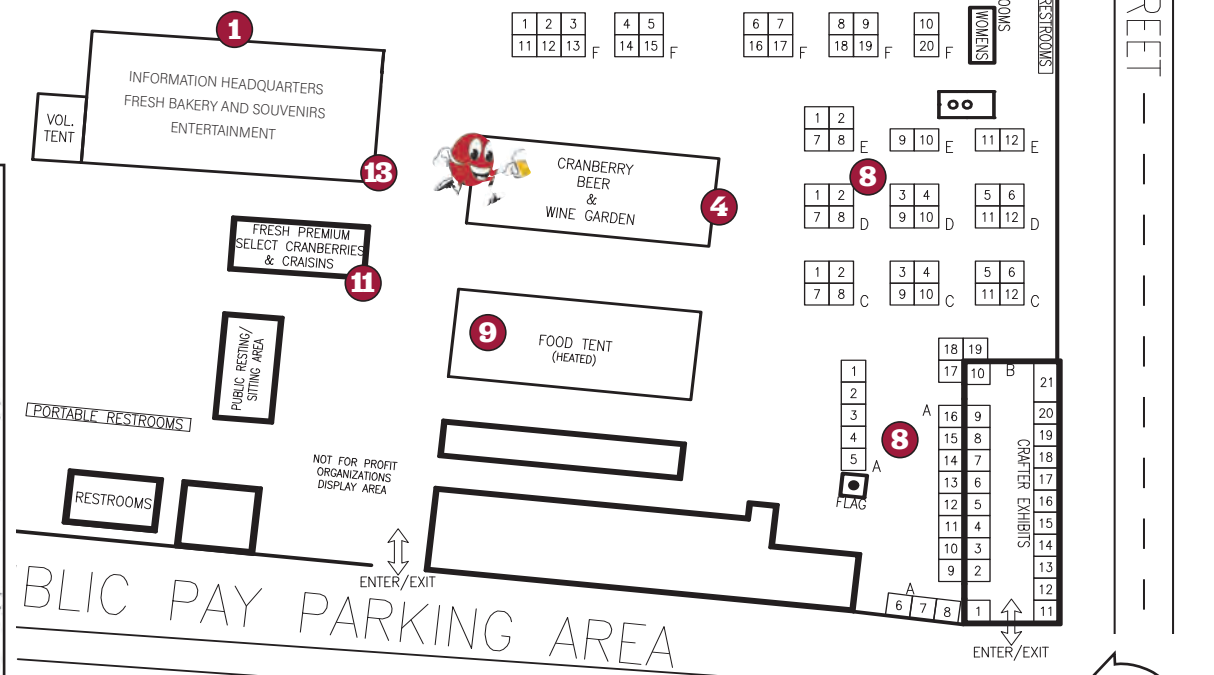
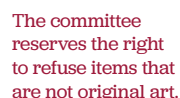
