

according to Parks and
Recreation Chapter
Ordinance 19.08 Animals.

"This ordinance will be enforced by event organizers and area law enforcement. You will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and could be fined, so please leave your animals at home," said a fest spokesperson.

In addition to any vendor, exhibitor and food concessionaire areas located at the Vilas County Fairgrounds, pets are not allowed at Riverside Park or Eagle River tennis courts.

"In areas where permitted, pets shall be kept on a leash no more than 8 feet long. All pets shall be effectively restrained or under the owner's control at all times," the spokesperson said.

River

Tour attendees will visit a marsh that has called Eagle River home for more than 75 years, learn the history of the cranberry marsh and how it has been developed into a 334-acre marsh throughout the years, see the layout of the cranberry marsh close-up with a scenic drive on the marsh and learn about harvest equipment.

Tour guides will explain the hard work that needs to be done at the marsh in spring, summer, fall and winter.

Visitors will learn why Wisconsin is No. 1 in cranberry production, plus they'll find out all of the health benefits received from eating cranberries.

After a scenic tour of the marsh itself, the second stop of the tour will be at the Lake Nokomis Cranberries tasting area, where they will be able to sample Lake Nokomis cranberry wine and other local wines.

There will also be samples of cranberry barbeque sauce, chocolate-covered cranberries and yogurt-covered cranberries.

The last stop of the tour will be at Lake Nokomis Cranberries Wine & Gift Shop, where visitors will find many cranberry-related items,

including cranberry wines, lotions, soaps, candles, sauces, jams and those delicious sweetened, dried cranberries. Also available will be farm-fresh cranberries straight from the marsh.

To become a part of the two-hour cranberry marsh tour and wine tasting, people should make their reservations early. Tours are very popular and book up quickly. Tours run Thursday, Oct. 2, through Sunday, Oct. 5.

Festival grounds parking to see changes in 2025

The task of getting an estimated 45,000 people to and from the Vilas County Fairgrounds for Cranberry Fest is a huge undertaking and will see some changes to operations this year.

All festival grounds parking for the 2025 event will only be able to enter from Highway 70 onto South Forrest Street, which will be a one-way street.

Drivers are asked to pay attention to signage and ask volunteers who will be on hand to direct traffic where they should exit the fairgrounds.

Parking assistance will again be provided by the Eagle River Lions Club — the cost of \$10 per car. Club members will be able to answer directional questions as well as guide fest-goers to the designated areas at the fairgrounds.

Proceeds from the parking fee will go to the Lions Club and Eagle River Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Center to support area projects and events.

Food tent to include pancake breakfast

The main food tent at Cranberry Fest is managed by the Abundant Life Church.

Growers farm more acreage of fruit than any other state, and also lead the globe in cranberry production. Many of the state's marshes are currently run by fifth- and sixth-generation growers.

Wisconsin cranberry crop projected at 5.3 million barrels

State expected to produce nearly two-thirds of U.S. crop

Wisconsin's cranberry growers are forecasting a 5.3-million-barrel harvest in 2025, according to the latest USDA National Agriculture Statistic Services (NASS) crop production report. If projections hold, Wisconsin will remain the largest cranberry producer in the world, expected to supply an estimated 65% of the nation's cranberries.


The NASS forecast — an early-season estimate based on voluntary grower surveys — marks the 31st consecutive year Wisconsin is projected to lead the nation in cranberry production. These projections can shift as the growing season progresses and conditions change.

Other top cranberry-producing states and their 2025 projections include Massachusetts at 1.75 million barrels, Oregon at 560,000 barrels, and New Jersey at 520,000 barrels. Overall, the U.S. crop is expected to total 8.13 million barrels. Wisconsin's final 2024 crop came in at 6.01 million barrels.

Cranberries have been Wisconsin's official state fruit for more than 20 years, earning the designation in 2004. They are the state's numberone fruit crop in both size and economic value.

Wisconsin cranberries are grown on 25,000 acres across 19 counties in the central and northern regions of the state. Approximately 5% of this year's crop will be sold as fresh fruit, and the remaining cranberries will be frozen and stored for longer-term sales as frozen berries, dried cranberries, juices, sauces and more.

Wisconsin's cranberry harvest typically begins in late September and runs through October.


